To present an overview of the different traditions and developments in sociological theory at the 20th century: Structural Functionalism, Symbolic Interactionism, Conflict Theory, Exchange Theory, and New Theoretical Movement at 1980s (Giddens, Bourdieu, Habermas, Alexander, Collins). The aim is to explore in an introductory way the different modes of theoretical thinking, the different theoretical logics behind the sociological theories and the way they answer the great questions of the discipline.
